
In Nursery we have all agreed that the following behaviour will be rewarded.

How to be a Nursery Superstar

We will try to:

- ❖ Do things for ourselves and try new things
- ❖ Share with our friends
- ❖ Have kind mouths, hands and feet
- ❖ Do good looking, listening and thinking
- ❖ Try hard to be good talkers

Behaviour and rewards

Unacceptable behaviour will not be tolerated and all incidents will be recorded on the behaviour log and parents informed. Unacceptable behaviour includes:

- ❖ Violent behaviour
- ❖ Stealing
- ❖ Bullying
- ❖ Deliberately damaging/defacing equipment/property
- ❖ Disobedience – persistent refusal to follow instructions from an adult
- ❖ Racism
- ❖ Fighting

Rewards include verbal praise and receiving star stickers. We will also be picking a 'Star of the Week' who show very good behaviour on that particular week, these children will receive a special certificate.



Good behaviour

In Nursery the children are rewarded for good behaviour by receiving verbal praise and a sticker.

Unacceptable behaviour

Children whose behaviour is unacceptable are given a verbal warning. If continue to behave in the same way they will have 'time out' in their classroom. Should they still behave unacceptably they will be sent to another class for a short period of time, their name will go in the class behaviour book and their parent will be informed.

For persistent unacceptable behaviour they will be sent to see the Assistant Head.
