This leaflet is designed to share with you the standards of behaviour and attitude that is expected of your child at our school.


It is very important that we work together to maintain the high standards of behaviour we already have in school and that all children clearly understand what is expected of them.



In Year 1 we have all agreed that the following behaviour will be rewarded.

How to be a Year One Superstar

- Be independent
- Always do your best and be proud of what you do
- Show respect for other people and their thoughts
- Listen to others
- Believe that 'you can'
- Be polite and have good manners
- Line up smartly, quietly and sensibly
- Take turns and share
- Good looking, listening and sitting – be ready to learn
- Look after our things in the Classroom



Behaviour and rewards

Children will collect individual stars in order to achieve a bronze, silver and gold award over the school year.

Bronze award = 50 stars Silver award = 100 stars
Gold award = 150 stars

Children in Reception will collect 10 stars for their bronze award, 20 stars for their silver award and 30 stars for their gold award.

Platinum awards will also be available for exceptional behaviour and progress.

Stars will be given by adults for a range of behaviours that have been agreed and shared with the children in each year group.


Details for your child are shown on the next page.

There will be a series of reward assemblies throughout the year to recognise those children that achieve their rewards by the 'challenge date'.

Unacceptable behaviour will not be tolerated and all incidents will be recorded on the behaviour log and parents informed. Unacceptable behaviour includes:

- ❖ Violent behaviour
- ❖ Stealing
- ❖ Bullying
- ❖ Deliberately damaging/defacing equipment/property
- ❖ Disobedience – persistent refusal to follow instructions from an adult
- ❖ Racism
- ❖ Fighting

In addition a system of red and yellow cards will be used during playtime and lunchtime to deal with unacceptable behaviour. Children will be shown a yellow card as a warning that their behaviour is unacceptable. If the behaviour continues a red card will be given (and the incident recorded).



Good behaviour

In Year 1 all teachers give out small rewards to children who have collected 10 and 30 stamps towards their Bronze award and then children receive a special certificate and wrist band when they have collected 50 stamps and filled their Bronze reward card.

For their Silver Reward card children will be rewarded as they collect 25 and 50 stamps.

For the gold award children will receive a small reward for collecting 50 and 100 stars.

Children are also rewarded for positive behaviour in the class by having their name recorded on a happy face board.

Unacceptable behaviour

Children whose behaviour is unacceptable will:

Firstly be warned that if they continue to behave in that way they will have their name recorded on the sad face board.

Secondly, should it continue, their name will be written on the sad face board.

If they still continue to act unacceptably they will have an X by their name and have to sit on their own in class for a short period of time (time out).

Should they get 2 X's they will spend a short amount of time out in another classroom, the parent will be informed and their name will go in the class behaviour book.

For persistent unacceptable behaviour they will be sent to see the Assistant Head.
