Routines and Organisation

Homework will be given out weekly, usually on a Friday and should be returned to school or completed online by the deadline set by the class teacher.

Much of the homework set will be completed online. However, if children are not able to access this, paper-based alternatives will be given. At Bordesley Green Primary School, we expect all children to attempt the homework set, we will keep registers and children who regularly do not keep complete tasks and deliberately opt out will lead to a conversation with the children and parents and spending part of the break/lunchtimes in school to complete tasks if necessary.

All homework will explained by the class teacher and relate to work completed in class, it is not our intention to give children homework which they cannot complete or have not experienced

previously, unless asked to complete a project linked to a curriculum topic such as Earth and Space or Victorians. Parents are not expected to teach new skills.

All homework will be reviewed by the class teacher but will not be marked in detail. Feedback can be given in a variety of ways including marking, sharing with the class in a discussion or displaying in the classroom.

Half-Termly Homework Projects

Homework projects will be assigned by teachers on the first week of each half term. Families will have the whole half term to complete the projects so parents have flexibility and quality projects can be completed. This homework will act as a recap and revision of that half term's Wider Curriculum topic. Each half term project will take the form of two lists of possible activities (one list will be exclusively Writing activities). Children choose at least one of the activities from each list and complete them over the half term, then bring them back to school at the start of the next half term.
