# Return to school

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We are looking forward to welcoming everyone back to school on **Monday 6<sup>th</sup> September.** All leaders and other staff will be on the playground and at the school gate to welcome you back on the first day.

The expectation is that all pupils will return and attendance is compulsory. The gates will be open from 8.30am-8.50am each morning, please make every effort to arrive between these times each day. All leaders and other staff will be on the playground to welcome you back on the first day.

School will end for all pupils at 3.20pm, there will be no staggered end to the day however the one-way route onto the playground will remain in place. On Friday's, school will finish at 12.30pm for all pupils.

We will continue to encourage your children to use hand sanitiser or regular hand washing with soap and water and more frequent cleaning of classrooms and touch points will take place.

Children are expected to wear school uniform to school from September and black school shoes. Brightly coloured trainers or shoes are not permitted.

Breakfast Club will begin from **Monday 6<sup>th</sup> September**, please contact the school office on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> or Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> September on if you would like a place. We are looking forward to running after school clubs from September. More information will follow about the exciting opportunities we will offer at the start of the term.

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#### Travelling to and from school

In September, can I ask that whenever possible you walk to school with your children or park sensibly and considerately when arriving at the start or end of the school day. On Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> July there was an incident outside of school where a member of our school community needed medical attention, an ambulance was called but could not drive up Drummond Road due to the inconsiderate parking of parents, fortunately the person needing treatment was ok however the fact that the ambulance was delayed could have had serious repercussions. It is not acceptable to double park, blocking the road or park on the zig zag lines, fines can be issued for both of these. We have regular support from the police and parking enforcement officers. Please support us to keep your children safe.
